5	(a) IN GENERAL.—Section $11(e)(6)$ of the Food and
6	Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2020(e)(6)) is amend-

8	(1) in subparagraph (A), by striking "and" at

10	(2) by adding at the end the following:
11	"(C) the State agency may waive recertifi-
12	cation interviews required by the Secretary sub-
13	ject to the condition that the applicant—
14	"(i) waives the interview; and
15	"(ii) has already demonstrated eligi-

17	"(D) if the Secretary requires an applicant

23	(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
